ORDINANCE 22-06: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS TITLE VII OF THE CITY OF FRANKFORT CODE OF ORDINANCES Revised 6/13/2022

<u>RESOLUTION 22-06:</u> A RESOLUTION IN RESPONSE TO NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF CLASS-ACTION PROPOSED SETTLEMENT

City Attorney Les Bergum informed the council that this resolution will allow the city to participate in a class-action lawsuit involving Monsanto Company and Solutia Inc. over PCBs contaminating bodies of water unless the council would like to opt-out of the lawsuit. The resolution also allows Mayor Sheets to apply for any other components of the lawsuit the city may qualify for.

Councilmember Beardsley made a motion to approve resolution 22-06, seconded by Councilmember Palmer. Upon a roll call vote, six ayes were recorded. Motion carried 6-0.
